

#### Here is a favorite recipe of Jacqueline and I. Enjoy!

#### **Cedar planked Salmon with Sundried Tomatoes**

- 1 -3 lb salmon fillet, deboned
- 6 large garlic, minced
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 4 tablespoons fresh parsley, chopped
- 2 tablespoons sun-dried tomatoes packed in oil, minced
- 1/4 cup olive oil

#### Directions:

- 1. Combine garlic and salt and grind into a paste. Combine the garlic, parsley, dried tomatoes and olive oil in a bowl; blending all ingredients. Chill until ready for use.
- 2. With a sharp knife, cut two lengthwise slits in the salmon fillet, dividing the surface of the fish into thirds. Cut to the skin, but not through it.
- 3. Preheat grill.
- 4. Spread half the garlic/tomato mixture over the fillet and into the slits. Place the fish on salmon plank and barbecue over a medium heat. Close the lid and grill for 15 minutes.
- 5. Spread the remaining garlic/tomato mixture on the fillet. Close the lid, turning the temperature to high and grill 10 minutes more, or until fish flakes when tested. Do not overcook as fish will become dry. It should be moist.
- 6. Remove the fish from the grill and serve.






## This is our story




In 1891 our church started in our forefathers homes. Our first Church was built in 1897, entirely by Volunteer labour with dove-tailed logs. The alter consisted of a square box covered with cloth. A small stove was in the middle of the room. The people often sat on chairs huddled around the stove.



Our first church was sold to Henry Schneider for \$100.00 and moved just south of our church and converted to a home. It sat on the farm now owned by Brian Bauer for a number of years. It has since been demolished.

A new church was built



Our new church was completed in 1925 by volunteer labour at the cost of \$1800.00. Most of the money was raised by Pledges.

Fifty-five years later, an addition was added to the church



In 1980 the construction for the addition to our church started with the removal of the alter portion on the church.



Basement foundation in place for the addition to the church. A new roof and insulation was added to old church then made into an office.



With a contractor and many volunteer hours the addition was completed and dedicated in August of 1980, at a cost of \$138,500. The mortgage was paid off by October 1994.
