The importance of slowing your Anger

I am working on a seminar on gaining freedom from the destructiveness of anger. I thought I would put a tidbit or two into the newsletter. The Bible gives us strategies to mitigate the damage anger and offense causes.

- You know this, my beloved brothers and sisters. Now everyone must be quick to hear, slow to speak, and slow to anger; for a man's anger does not bring about the righteousness of God. James 1:19-20
- ♦ A gentle answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger. Proverbs 15:1
- ♦ A hot-tempered person stirs up strife, But the slow to anger calms a dispute. Proverbs 15:18

Hot tempered people are known for reacting out of their anger or passion. They often do not think. They react. In their passion driven reaction, they often cause more damage than they fix.

They want to express their emotion in the moment and in doing so they offend and hurt others. In their desire to express their anger they often have no thought of helping bring a solution. They need to express their feelings, and their anger catalyzes the anger of others around them.

Learning to slow your anger is a discipline that the Bible calls us to practice. It helps mitigate the passion and encourages people to come together in compromise. Slowing your angry response allows you to hear others and makes them feel valued. It prevents misunderstandings. The Proverbs above encourage us to deliberately slow our response when we are in a situation where we can feel the anger and offense rising within us. Do not react to offenses given. Pray and invite God into the discussion. Share with the other person(s) involved in your situation thoughtfully and deliberately. Keep the focus on resolving the offense and moving forward together. The unity created by forgiving and refusing to carry offense binds us together as the body of Christ and prevents the devil from dividing us and destroying our community.

Prayer at Immanuel

There are a number of options for both participating in praying and receiving prayer at Immanuel. It is important to remember that when we gather to pray God has promised to be there with us and when we are united or agreeing together in prayer we are promised that God hears us and responds as well as being the answer to Jesus prayer recorded in John 17.

Tuesday mornings at 10, a group led by Russ Graff, meets to pray for Immanuel Church and its members and concerns specifically. Anyone is welcome to join them at any time.

Then, as noted in the Elders report you are welcome to join their prayer time every Wednesday evening at 7 pm. We also have opportunity to receive Prayer Ministry. After church we currently have 4 teams that rotate to be available to pray with you and invite Jesus into whatever the concern or issue may be. Our teams have attended Spoken Word Ministries course: Effective Prayer Ministry and are equipped as well as being committed to confidentiality. If the concern is greater than a short after church prayer is able to address a Prayer Ministry appointment may be required and can be arranged by speaking to any of the Graffs, Hopkins, or Neimans (Elder team).

Come and learn about the biblical pattern for outpourings of the Holy Spirit that lead to revival.


Be part of the concert of prayer as we together ask for the Holy Spirit to start with us.



Hello Friends and Family,

Daniel's school started again in February, and Julie restarted her language classes also. Our language study is progressing well — we're able to do most things that we need to do, and can get our point across even if it doesn't sound pretty. Daniel has been enjoying this semester at university more, as the level is a bit higher and the teachers speak mostly in Urdu instead of English.

This month we've been enjoying some other opportunities as well. Daniel has started teaching an English and life skills class once a week to Christian youth in the slum in our city, close to his university. They are a fun group and it has been a blessing for Daniel to be able to do some teaching even while studying. Daniel was also invited to do some specialized English courses for elementary teachers here who have to teach in English, even though it is not their first language. It has been a fun challenge for him to develop an English for Teachers course, and got us thinking about possible future opportunities for starting a teaching/training related business. Julie has started her Master's in International Health online.

This is a way for her to keep up her Canadian nursing license during this season, while also gaining a credential and skills related to nursing in contexts like this one. Julie has also been enjoying playing volleyball with a group of ladies here – which gives her a chance to get out of the house and make some more local friends.

We've both been feeling the call to rest in Christ, to abide in Him, and lay the labour at his feet. There are so many things to think about when we run about doing things in our own strength, but really only one thing when we look to Him. "Trust and obey, for there's no other way, to be happy in Jesus, than to trust and obey." We need more of that! Our own efforts are so small and fruitless – only He provides the fruit that can last.



There are 3 stages in life:

Wanting Stuff:
