



God be with you and yours this season as we enter a new year. We had our whole family here in Stony Plain for Christmas, except our oldest and his wife who remain in Denmark this year. Things at the Church here are going well. We had good a Christmas eve service and enjoyed connecting with those who came out. It was a winter wonderland that evening, with many inches of fresh snow. We continue to point to Jesus as our Lord and Savior and we pray that He touches many hearts to turn people to the gospel.

On the itinerant side of the ministry, Spoken Word continues to grow and reach out with the gospel. Our Saskatchewan team is going great guns, and I will be in Saskatoon in the new year to do a seminar and a men's conference aimed at equipping people to serve Christ. Our Alberta opportunities and team are growing as well. Hopkins Ministries International in the States is also getting some traction. I will be doing a teaching series in Arizona in early February. That should be fun.

Internationally, I just got back from North Kenya. I have been teaching the Freedom Through Forgiveness and Dealing with Temptation material in the Turkana region for the past three years and we are getting some good traction. It will be interesting to see where God takes that. Had over 1000 participants in the training this year. There are now two Kenyan bishops and a missionary to Pakistan running their own seminars based on the Forgiveness seminar teachings, and so I consult with them. Very exciting to see that. All in all, things are good. Jacqueline continues to be my greatest partner in all of this. For that I am ever thankful.

God be with you. Thank you for your prayers and support. We are blessed.

My name is **Hayden Barkey**. I first came to Rock solid in the summer of 2021. I had been kicked out of my house, and was living with some family friends in the city, had been using cocaine and was starting to use meth. I was depressed, lonely, and angry at the world.

God used RSR to save me from addiction and self destruction.
It changed my life and I wouldn't be here if it weren't for my time in the program.

That's not to say everything was perfect after I graduated. I still had my struggles and troubles, but I was able to graduate high school, and get tested for my red seal in carpentry and start my own small business.

Fresh out of school, working for myself, advancing in the trades, living in my own place, making good money. **"so why do I feel so empty?"**

I pulled over on my way home one day, exhausted by this nagging question and prayed. I had never lost my faith since and leaving RSR, but I certainly wasn't leaning on God. My first time earnestly praying in a long time.

In that moment, God spoke to me in a way that I had never experienced before. He spoke in a way I still can't fully explain. Not only did He make it clear that His plan for me was back at Rock Solid, but He took away from me the junk that I was still carrying around. His light shone so bright in my heart, and I know he wanted that light to shine through me into the darkness of students' live at RSR.

That's why I'm back as a staff member at Rock Solid Refuge, so that His light can shine and He can be glorified.

I know that this program works, because it worked for me

Brownie Mix Cookies

Ingredients:

1—18 ounce box of Brownie mix
2 eggs
1/4 cup vegetable oil
1/4 cup flour
1 teaspoon vanilla
1 cup chocolate chips

Instructions:

1. Heat oven to 375-degrees. Grease cookie sheet with non-stick spray or line with parchment paper.
2. Add the brownie mix to a large bowl
3. Add eggs, oil, vanilla and flour and mix well. (It will be a very thick dough)
4. Add chocolate chips and mix
5. Roll the cookies in 1-1/2 balls and set them two inches apart on cookie sheet.
6. Bake for 10 minutes and allow to cool for at least 10 minutes before moving them from the pan.
7. Cool on cooling rack.
